


OUR MISSION

Founded in 1994, Pacekids Programs started out as a pilot program serving only six children and has continued to expand to now serving over 400 children and families each year. Pacekids is a dynamic, active environment, specializing in family-centred, therapeutic, play based learning objectives that nurture each child's unique developmental and physical needs through a variety of programs.



To best serve the children in our programs, Pacekids has built a team of dedicated experts comprised of Early Childhood Educators, Preschool Teachers, Occupational Therapists, Speech-Language Pathologists, Physiotherapists, Behavioural Strategists, Psychologists, Program Supervisors, Child Development Assistants, Family Development Coaches and a devoted support team.

Ariya started with Pacekids Programs in September of 2015 in the Early Childhood Services Program. This beautiful little girl has Ret t Syndrome, which for Ariya means she is in an adaptive wheel chair, has limited motor skills and is completely non-verbal. When Ariya started working with the Pacekids Speech Team, she began learning how to use an eye gaze technology device called the PC Eye that was generously funded by the TELUS Calgary Community Board. This technology tracks an individual's eye movements on a screen, allowing them to select wants and needs, express feelings and communicate with others.

The PC Eye gave Ariya a voice. Before this technology Ariya could not communicate with her family, friends or peers. Thanks to Eye Gaze technology, Ariya can communicate with those around her and express her wants, needs and her vibrant personality.

With Ariya set to graduate from kindergarten in the spring of 2017, the Pacekids Speech Team began looking into a permanent solution that Ariya could take on to grade one, however the technology costs approximately \$18,000 to \$20,000. Without a personal eye gaze device, Aryia would lose her progress along with the voice and ability to communicate that she had so recently discovered. After months of the Pacekids team working with Augmentative Communication and Educational Technology Service (ACETS), Aryia and her family were granted the funding required to purchase a personal device!

Ariya is one of the youngest individuals in Canada to ever receive funding for a personal eye gaze device and that is all thanks to her having the opportunity to trial the technology here at Pacekids Programs. Her success would not have been possible without the generous donation from the TELUS Calgary Community Board and the hard work of her dedicated teachers, therapists and family.



"We were gifted Zayden on August 12, 2012. He was a perfect little boy, 1oz bigger than his brother. You could see the sparkle in his eyes, the happiness on his face. The first 28 days of Zayden's life were perfect; just what it was suppose to be – then things took a turn for the worst. We as a family experienced his first seizure, little did we know at the time what was to come for Zayden, we were all terrified. It took two solid years, countless battles and multiple doctors to get a confirmed diagnosis. While we were in the process of getting his diagnosis – Zayden was have debilitating seizures, they were onwards and upwards of 100 per day. It was not until 2014 that we received Zaydens diagnosis – Dravet Syndrome. It was from that moment on we decided as a family that we would never allow Zayden's diagnosis to define him, only Zayden would define himself and all the greatness that was to come forhim.

The doctors made a point of telling us not to have much hope, that he would develop then regress; his seizures would only get worse, that his quality of life would be poor and that his life expectancy would be surprising if he made it past five. They put out every flame in our hearts that we had for him. I remember looking into support services for Zayden and coming across Pacekids - I thought to myself there has to be a place out there for him, a place that would not let his seizures define him, a place that would let him thrive and learn and be himself, a place were he could actually have friends. **Turns out Pacekids was it.** I will never forget walking into Pacekids for the first time, seeing how happy the children were, seeing the interaction with the kids and how it was all about them, seeing every child development assistant attend to their child with love and strength. I knew then this was the place for Zayden.

Zayden started at Pacekids in 2015. He had no way of communicating, he would not make eye contact with anyone, he pretty much hated everyone and everything. He had spent so much of his little life in the hospital with doctors and



nurses; being poked and prodded that he did not like anyone besides his family. He didn't know how to share, he had almost no core strength and he basically had no fine motor skills.

And now here we are in 2017 and Pacekids has changed Zayden's life. Zayden, although he is non-verbal, has multiple ways to communicate with us now, he looks at everyone and everything and you can tell what he has to say through his eyes. He is in love with all of his teachers, CDA's and friends, and he will actually take turns with classmates. He has overcome all obstacles and restrictions that the doctors had put on him – and this is all thanks to Pacekids. Zayden is able to be the best version of himself and its all because of the amazing individuals who make up this team!

As a family we will never be able to give Pacekids what they have given us. The support, the shoulders to cry on and most of all our incredible little boy. Zayden continues to amaze us everyday, and its all thanks to the teachers, the Child Development Assistants, and the rest of the team - its because of Pacekids! I wish the world could see what an impact they make. What beautiful souls they have to be able to come in everyday and help all these kiddos, and know how important it is to them and their families.

Although this may be our last year with Pacekids, the marks that have been left on our hearts by this organization will be with us forever. We cannot wait to see where Zayden's life takes us, but I know it will be towards great things and its all because of Pacekids - so thank you! Thank you from the bottom of our hearts.


