

Pacekids has remained steadfast in our commitment to being family focused and striving for excellence in the therapy, education, and empowerment of children with diverse needs and their families.


Today, Pacekids proudly serves over 600 children and families across the Calgary region each year.

Our Impact

Six-year-old Caspar can be found rolling down Pacekids' hallways, smiling at his friends and saying good morning to his teacher – a future beyond what parents Megan and Chris could have imagined a few years ago.

The young parents suspected something was wrong around 6 months old when Caspar was not meeting developmental milestones. At 12 months, they were talking to his doctor about these concerns and by 18 months they had been referred to a pediatric specialist. As the family began their search for a formal diagnosis, monthly physio and speech therapy, with countless medical appointments and tests became the norm.

At 36 months, these professionals recommended finding a specialized school for Caspar.

"We were really lost – this was a whole new world for us," said Chris. "Once we started at Pacekids, we felt like we were in the right place."

While Caspar was attending Pacekids, the family received a diagnosis of a rare neurological disorder, KIF1A Associative Neurological Disorder. This diagnosis allowed Megan and Chris to connect with similar families and begin to chart their path forward.

During all of this, Caspar continued to take strides forward in his classroom.

"We were constantly surprised, when we thought Casper would not be able to do something, then all of the sudden he would – like counting to twenty," said Chris.

"These milestones he started hitting made us realize that he could do it," said Megan. "It gave us a hope for Casper's future."

Program Highlights

Last year we supported 600 children with diverse needs and their families through Pacekids' two schools, in the community, and in family homes.

Over 13,500 hours directly providing services in the family homes.

1661 Individualized Program Plan goals set and 1191 goals met!

Almost 820 hours providing assessment services – ensuring more than 250 children could access Pacekids' services.

417 FSCD contracts supporting 323 families in the home.

More than 520 music therapy sessions, and 26 field trips and experiences.

A team of teachers, aides, psychologists, speech language pathologists, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, and behavioral strategists working with children and their families each day.




